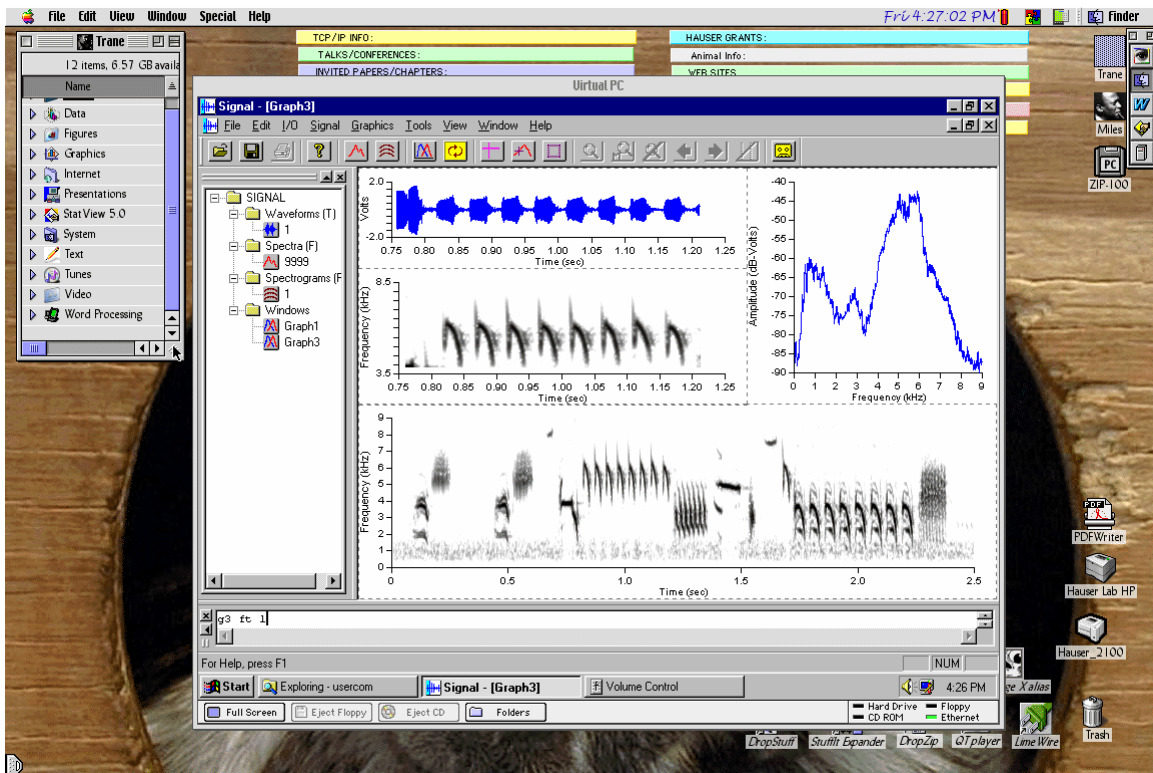


SIGNAL on the Macintosh !!

SIGNAL 4.0 can be run from the Macintosh desktop !

Among the accessories linking PCs and Macs is a Macintosh program called VirtualPC™ that presents a full Windows 98 or Windows 2000 in a window on the Macintosh desktop. This magic allows SIGNAL 4.0 to be run on a Macintosh computer. All SIGNAL computational, display, and programming capabilities are supported on the Macintosh, and analog I/O will be supported through the built-in Macintosh sound chip in the near future. VirtualPC for Windows98 costs under \$200. System requirements are a Macintosh G3 or G4, Mac OS 8.5 or higher, 128 MB memory, and 1 GB of free disk space.
